It was a good year for the stock market. The market certainly climbed a wall of worry and the S-P 500 returned +13.35% on a price basis – and +15.95% on a total return basis (includes reinvested dividends). You wouldn't know it from the chatter in the media. This is evidence that the market is not necessarily the economy as we had another year of slow growth. But a faster growing economy would certainly help the market. Being a forward looking indicator, maybe that is what it is predicting for the future. Housing looks to be recovering, the valuation of the market is reasonable, a lot of cash on the sidelines, and a potential domestic energy boom are positive factors for continued growth in the market and the economy. As we know, predicting the return of the market in any one year is a coin flip, but the long-term picture looks bright to me.

There are potential negatives to be sure and the one that immediately comes to mind is dysfunctional Washington Politicians. Some would say that is **par for the course** (myself included). But unfortunately, in this period of time, it affects short-term stock market movements. I continue to believe however, that economic cycles are more powerful than politics, and the market will continue to climb that "Wall of Worry" and reward long term investors with solid returns.
